CREATING REMOTE WORKPLACES FOR REFUGEES

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Transient populations need access to an income, especially when barred from the local economy, due to legal restrictions experienced during displacement/migration, or even when resettled through official channels, due to linguistic and cultural barriers- and even discrimination. NaTakallam finds vets, recruits and trains refugees /displaced persons as online tutors, teachers, translators and conversation partners, when relevant, with NGO partners in countries neighboring conflict zones. Once onboarded, NaTakallam supports candidates with additional training and matches them with “jobs”, including teaching a language, engaging in cultural exchange sessions, or translating a variety of projects. Clients include major US universities such as Duke, Yale, International Rescue Committee, Ben&Jerry’s and the Malala Fund. To date, refugees & displaced persons have self-generated \$800.000 through NaTakallam.
